CAPC Definition Palliative Care

Palliative care, and the medical sub-specialty of palliative medicine, is specialized medical care for people living with serious illness. It focuses on providing relief from the symptoms and stress of a serious illness. The goal is to improve quality of life for both the patient and the family.





Definition of Palliative Care cont.

Palliative care is provided by a **team** of palliative care doctors, nurses, social workers and others who work together **with a patient's other doctors** to provide an **extra layer of support**. It is appropriate at **any age** and at **any stage in a serious illness** and can be provided **along with curative treatment**.

Gaps Addressed

1. Pain and Symptom Management

- My cancer is being treated and shrinking, but I have so much pain/nausea/trouble breathing. I don't know if I can take much more. My cancer doctor is trying things but I am miserable. Can you help me?
- My husband has Alzheimer's and he is having more difficulty swallowing. Will a feeding tube help him get better?





Gaps Addressed

2. Goals of Care Discussions

- My husband has stage IV cancer and doesn't want more treatment but I want him to keep fighting. What should I do?
- My dad has congestive heart failure and is getting worse. How can my mom and I take care of him?
- My grandmother is in a skilled nurse facility and has had three pneumonias in the past six months. She is tired of going to the hospital. Do we have to keep going back to the hospital?





3. Advance Care Planning

- My husband and I want to make plans for our retirement and our future. We have questions about a durable power of attorney for healthcare. Can you answer those questions? Why do we need to have one?
- What is this pink sheet called a POLST (Physician's Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment). Do I need one?





4. Patient/Family Healthcare Provider Disagreement/Conflict

My sister had a large stroke and is not able to speak or eat and the doctors say she needs a feeding tube. I don't think she would want one but her husband thinks she would. Who decides?





5. Family Meetings (in-person, phone, FaceTime)

- ☐ My husband is dying of cancer and I don't know what to say to my school age kids. Can you help me?
- My two daughters are flying in from out of state and they want to know what is going on with my cancer treatment, but it's so complicated. Can you help me explain things to them?





6. Caregiving Planning & Safety Assessments

- My wife fell and broke her hip. She had surgery and is now in a rehab facility. I work and can't take care of her. How can I keep her from falling? I am overwhelmed!
- □ Should I buy long term care insurance?
- Can you recommend a good skilled nurse facility?





7. Psychosocial and Spiritual Support

- My cancer is getting better but I can't sleep because I am so anxious and afraid of going to sleep and not waking up!
- Why did God let me have cancer? I have tried to be a good person my whole life!





8. Medication Questions

- My mother is having trouble keeping track of her medicines, what they are for and how to take them. Can you help us?
- My doctor is prescribing morphine for my pain but I am afraid of taking it, I don't want to become addicted!





9. Healthcare System Questions

- □ I want a second opinion on my mom's cancer. Where should I go?
- Does my insurance pay for caregiving help or a skilled nursing facility?





10. Fear of Hospice

- ☐ My oncologist mentioned hospice, but I don't think I'm ready for hospice. I want to keep fighting!
- What is the difference between palliative care and hospice? Which one is better? Will my insurance cover one or both?





11. Alternative Treatment Questions

- My kids want me to try medical marijuana for my pain and to help cure my cancer but does it work? I don't want to be "high!"
- □ Can acupuncture help my back pain?





12. End Of Life Option Act Questions

□I want to die using that new law in California. Can you help me?





13. Japanese Cultural Questions which Affect Healthcare Decision Making

My eldest brother thinks he should make medical decisions for my dad, but I am his daughter who takes care of him, knows him the best and talks to all his doctors. Shouldn't I be his decision maker?





14. Transportation Questions

I don't think my dad should be driving anymore, but how can he get to his many doctors appointments and physical therapy sessions?
