

Watercolor Painting

LOOSE PAINT AND DOODLE

SUPPLY LIST:

Paint Brushes	Round brush (pointed), Liner brush (or a small round), Flat brush (½" Optional).
Paint Trays	3 well paint tray and 1 larger mixing tray (can use plastic, paper, porcelain, but some watercolors can stain porcelain dishes) or a watercolor paint set that has red, blue and yellow and a lid to use to mix the paints.
Paints	Watercolor paints (tubes, pans, set) – at least the colors red, blue and yellow.
Water Cups (2)	One for washing brushes (dirty water) & one for mixing with paints (clean water).
Paper	Watercolor paper (140 lb.) 9" x 12".
Painting Board	Wood, plastic, composite board, clip board, clean cutting board or cutting mat to tape the watercolor paper to.
Masking Tape	Roll of masking tape, Blue Painter's tape, Frog tape, Washi tape or Surgical tape.
Towels	Either a couple paper towels or an old cloth rag.
Pen	Waterproof illustrating pen or a fine ball point pen.
Pencil	

PREPARATION PRIOR TO ZOOM MEETING:

1. Divide the paper into 4 sections (roughly 3¾" x 5"), allow for a 3/8 to ½ inch border around each picture. Tape to the painting board.
2. If your paints are in tubes dab a little paint into the paint trays. If you are using paints from the last watercolor session add a small amount of water to the paints.
3. Fill both water cups with water about ½ to ¾ full.
