

KEIRO FORUM ZOOM MEETING – JUNE 21, 2022

WATERCOLOR PAINTING – INK & WASH

SUPPLY LIST:

Pencil	Hard lead pencil.
Pen	Waterproof pen (i.e. Sakura Pigma Micron pen or Tombow Fudenosuke pen).
Eraser	Soft eraser if you have one.
Paint Brushes	Round brush
Paints	Watercolor paint set or watercolor paints (tubes, pans) – at least the colors red, blue and yellow.
Water Cups (2)	One for washing brushes (dirty water) and one for mixing with paints (clean water).
Paper	Watercolor paper.
Painting Board	Wood, plastic or composite board to tape the paper to. Can use a clip board or clean cutting board or the cutting mat you use for crafts (Fiskars cutting mat).
Masking Tape	Masking tape, Blue painter's tape, Frog tape, Surgical tape or Washi tape.
Towels	Paper towels or an old cloth rag.
Hair Dryer	To dry between washes.
Photograph	Attached photo of a house.

OPTIONAL SUPPLY LIST:

Fountain Pen	Black waterproof ink or cartridge.
Graphite Paper	Do not use carbon paper. As an alternative you could use a graphite pencil (see below for instructions).

PREPARATION PRIOR TO ZOOM MEETING:

1. Divide a whole sheet of watercolor paper in half (6" x 9") allow about a ¼" to 3/8" border around each section. We will draw and paint on one half and the other can be used to do a second ink & wash on your own.
2. Either free hand draw the house onto the watercolor paper with a pencil or use the graphite paper to trace the picture onto a half sheet of the watercolor paper. If you do not have graphite paper take a graphite pencil rub the lead onto the back of the picture of the house making sure you cover all the parts of the house that you want to transfer onto the watercolor paper. Then trace the picture of the house onto the half sheet of watercolor paper. (During the class session we will use the waterproof pen (or fountain pen) to draw the picture of the house that we will paint.)

3. If your paints are in tubes dab a little paint into the paint trays or pans.
4. Fill both water cups with water about ½ to ¾ full.
5. Tape the watercolor paper to a Painting Board
