

Navigating Local Transportation with Confidence

As we age, understanding our transportation options can be a great way to preserve our autonomy, especially as physical and cognitive changes begin to impede our ability to drive safely. Below, you will find a variety of alternative transportation options available in Los Angeles, Orange, and Ventura counties including rideshare apps, shuttles, and public transportation.

Rideshare: Best Practices

- Double check your starting location and destination
- Notify emergency contact that you are taking the trip beforehand and share your location during the ride (see resources below)
- Before you are at your destination and as you leave the vehicle, make sure you have all your belongings

Rideshare: Assistants

- GoGo Grandparent (gogograndparent.com): Subscription ride and delivery operator service for older adults
 - Reserve rides through ride-sharing companies without a smartphone, app, or computer
 - Can be used for grocery orders, meals, and prescription drug delivery
 - Monthly plans range from: \$11.72, \$20.49, \$81.99, and \$409.99 (as of 12/2024)

- Arrive Rides (arriverides.com/how-it-works/): A phone concierge service for senior transportation on-demand.
 - Works similarly to GoGo Grandparent
 - \$10 per month plus ride fare (as of 12/2024)

Shuttles for Older Adults: General Overview

- Paratransit services for older adults (usually 60-65 & older, depending on service region) who are functionally able-bodied or functionally disabled
 - o Also serves people under 60 who are functionally disabled
- Provide curb-to-curb service, drivers cannot physically assist passengers
- Shared ride van service to any location within service area
- Fare: roughly ranges between free and \$4.00 per ride (as of 12/2024)
- Appointments are required
- Hours vary by service area
- Some offer services a few miles outside of outline, contact service or read brochure for more details on service area

Access Overview

- For functionally disabled individuals
- Curb-to-curb shared-ride service
- Requires Access Rider Identification Card
- Schedule rides one day in advance, can schedule 1-6 one-way trips per call
 - OC Access has same-day service
- As a shared ride service your travel time will be similar to that of a fixed-route bus, not a car or taxi
- One-way trips \$2.75-\$3.60 (as of 12/2024)
- Two different programs: Access and OC Access (links below)

 - Provides service within ¾ mile of LA County fixed-route bus and rail lines,
 same schedule as most buses
 - Extends into portions of San Bernardino, Orange, and Ventura counties

Non-Emergency Medical Transportation (NEMT) and Non-Medical Transportation (NMT)

- California Department of Health Care Services Definitions:
 - Non-emergency medical transportation (NEMT) is transportation by ambulance, wheelchair van, or litter van for those who cannot use public or private transportation.
 - Non-medical transportation (NMT) is transportation by private or public vehicle for people who do not have another way to get to their appointments.
